## Te mahi kauawhi, Inclusive practice

Our curriculum here at WCK is based on Te mahi kauawhi, Inclusive practice. Everyone is welcome here and we work hard to support our whole centre whānau through whatever challenges they may be facing. All tamariki have the right to access the full depth and breadth of our curriculum and feel a sense of belonging here.

A fully inclusive early childhood services provides an environment which invites, acknowledges, and celebrates the diversity that each child and their whānau bring. This includes those with disabilities, health needs, diverse family types, refugee, migrant and minority families. An inclusive curriculum is strengths-based and respects and connects with Māori values and the principles of Te Whāriki.

We want to create a community culture here that ensures all tamariki can be actively involved in meaningful play and learning with and alongside their peers. This includes providing additional supports or removing barriers when required, to promote participation and learning.

Please support us in this very important kaupapa, philosophy, here at Country Kids by being role models for ngā tamariki and demonstrating kindness and consideration for others. Sometimes we can never know what someone is truly going through.








#### **EOTC to the Cooks Beach Fire Station**
