






Working with Harakeke 🌳




WCK Centre Internal Evaluation 2023

We had a great pld session with Chrissy Leeper from Leap Education, who spent the day with us and provided MoE funded SELO support for community based centres like ours. We focused on building our centre's Internal Evaluation and Professional Growth Cycle processes. As a result of this pld, we have further reviewed the wording of our centre's internal evaluation question for this year. Our question is now: "How well are we providing equitable opportunities for tamariki to learn through a responsive curriculum?"



THE CURRENT RATIOS

The ratio is currently one teacher per five children under two and two teachers per twenty children over two. We are proposing 1:4 teacher to child ratio for under three's. 1:4 -U3!

THE WORDING ON THE PARLIAMENTARY PETITION

I respectfully request: That the House of Representatives implement a 1:4 ratio for under threes (one teacher to four children under three years of age attending Early Childhood Education) supported by realistic funding so that the Early Childhood Education sector can affordably deliver this ratio.
