# **Supporting Transitions to Kura, School**

"Learning is a journey that begins before birth and continues throughout life. Each part of the education system has a responsibility for supporting children (and the adults they become) on this lifelong journey of exploration. Kaiako and new entrants' teachers support children by affirming their identity and culture, connecting with and building on their funds of knowledge and having positive expectations for their learning" (Te Whāriki, Ministry of Education 2017, p. 51). Our early childhood curriculum focuses on goals and learning outcomes for tamariki. These include the development of learning dispositions and key competencies, which build a child's attitudes to learning.

One of the aims of the transition-to-school process is to support children as they develop the important disposition of resilience. Resilience is the ability to adapt to change, to work through problems that arise, to look for solutions, and to keep trying even when it is not easy. Children need to know that it is okay if they find starting school hard, it is okay that it is different to what they know, and that it will take some adjusting to. It is okay if they feel nervous about it.

There are many ways that we can support tamariki throughout this journey. One simple way could be encouraging tamariki to walk into the centre and to carry their own bag when they arrive and depart. Looking after their belongings is part of learning to manage themselves and gives tamariki a sense of empowerment in this process.
